



**OFFICE OF GREEK LIFE  
POLICIES REGARDING SOCIAL EVENT REGISTRATION**

In the event an organization fails to register a \*Social Event\* with the Office of Greek Life, the following will occur:

**First Offense:**

- a. The organization(s) will be limited to hosting/sponsoring/co-sponsoring 1 Social Event for the remainder of the semester.
- b. The organization(s) must schedule a meeting with the President, Social Chair/person responsible for the event, Risk Management officer (if appropriate), and appropriate Greek Advisor.

**Second Offense:**

- a. The organization(s) will be prohibited from hosting/sponsoring/co-sponsoring **any** Social Event for the remainder of the semester.

**Third Offense:**

- a. The organization(s) will be considered "***In Poor Standing***" with the Office of Greek Life.
- b. The organization(s) will be ineligible for *Chapter of the Year* and *Chapter Progress Awards* for the next Greek Awards Ceremony.
- c. The organization(s) will be prohibited from hosting/sponsoring/co-sponsoring **any** Social Event for the remainder of the semester **OR** the next ten weeks while school is in session (whichever is longer).

**\*Social Event Definition\***

A Social Event is defined as any event, including but not limited to; parties, mixers/icebreakers, date parties, formals, and/or any event that includes alcohol.

**Note:**

- Violations of this policy will be compiled and reported on an annual basis to the University of North Texas Dean of Students Office.
- From the date of the *First Offense*, organization(s) must have 12 months free of any violations to avoid the next level of consequences.
- When necessary, the appropriate council judicial boards, the Office of Greek Life, and/or the Center for Student Rights and Responsibilities (CSRR) will respond to violations of the above.
